The Editorial Office of the Journal of the National Science Foundation of Sri Lanka has conducted an author feedback survey, a first of such kind in 2024.


The objective was to ensure smooth publication process by identifying author experience on JNSF editorial process.

- \$\text{S} This report presents author responses for questions on author experience, publication process, editorial office support, *etc*.


Author demography

- >> Geographical diversity: Authors from Sri Lanka (70%), and foreign authors from India, Malaysia, Saudi Arabia, Serbia, and Canada participated in the Survey.
- **>>** Author affiliation: 86% were from the local and foreign universities.
- **>>** Amongst the respondents, 79.5% were Ph.D holders.




>> Nearly 48% authors possess more than 20 years of research experience.


Research Expeieince of JNSF authors (2022 & 2023)




What drives Authors to publishing with JNSF?
