The Editorial Office of the Journal of the National Science Foundation of Sri Lanka has conducted an author feedback survey, a first of such kind in 2024.

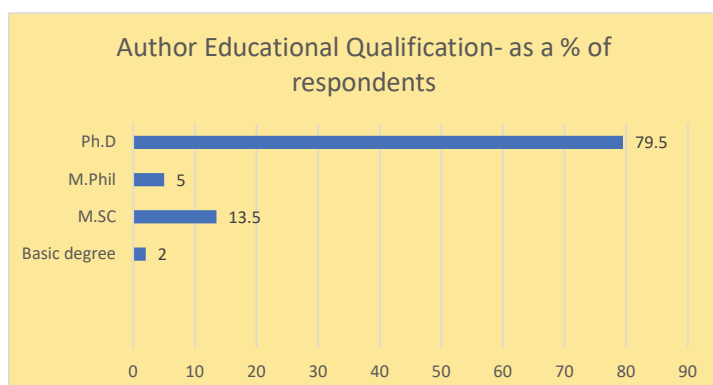
The objective was to ensure smooth publication process by identifying author experience on JNSF editorial process.

Facts about the Survey

- ✧ Corresponding Authors (100) who have published with the JNSF during 2022 & 2023 were invited to participate.
- ✧ 37% of the authors who have published with the JNSF during 2023 & 2023 participated in the Survey.
- ✧ Responses were collected through a Google form.
- ✧ This report presents author responses for questions on author experience, publication process, editorial office support, *etc.*

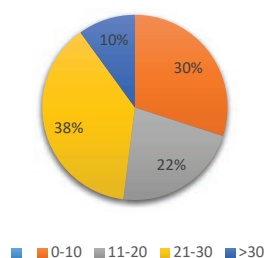
Author demography

- » Geographical diversity: Authors from Sri Lanka (70%), and foreign authors from India, Malaysia, Saudi Arabia, Serbia, and Canada participated in the Survey.
- » Author affiliation: 86% were from the local and foreign universities.
- » Amongst the respondents, 79.5% were Ph.D holders.



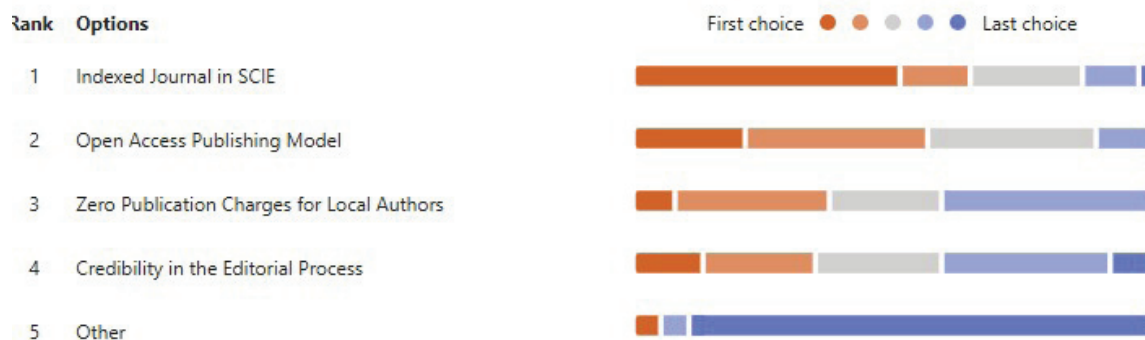
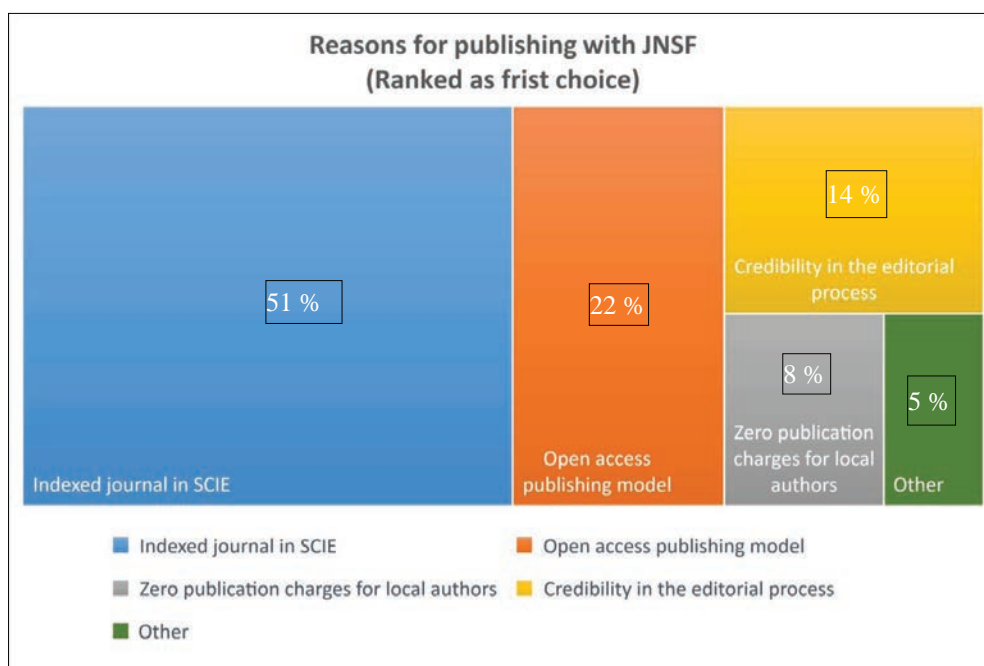
» Nearly 48% authors possess more than 20 years of research experience.

What drives Authors to publishing with JNSF ?

» For the question on “Reasons for publishing with JNSF”, the authors responded with choice of preference, where JNSF being an indexed journal has been selected by the majority (51%) as their first choice.
